COACHES REPORT

We started this years season in late August with our first Sunday training session. This session probably reflected the 1st and 2nd grades attitude to training this year with very few of this group attending. On the other side of the coin these early training session were attended by a large proportion of the current 3rd and 4th grade sides whom both coincidently won their respective one day competitions and are currently playing off in the main competition finals.

I would like to congratulate both Dave Dunstan and Justin Varney and their charges on a terrific season for the club. Both 3rds and 4ths attitude and attendance at training was first class throughout the season and their results reflect this.

Reflecting on the 1st and 2nd grades training this season, you could say that at most times only half of the two sides ever attended training at the same time. This makes it very difficult for training to attain levels required to prepare for the weekend battles ahead. If the 3rd and 4th grade sides can attend training then there is no reason for the 1st and 2nds not too. As a matter of fact there are more reasons for them to attend as they are in privileged positions in the club representing the club at the highest levels and are looked up to by the 3rd and 4th grade players as examples to follow.

At this point I would like to thank those 1st and 2nd grade players who nearly always turned up at training and gave a 100% commitment. They know who they are so I don't have to mention names.

Reflecting on the season in more detail, it seemed that we played in two halves, one prior to Christmas and one after Christmas. Prior to Christmas we had basically all four grades in the top four grades in the top 3 in the one day competition. Basically all four grades were playing some pretty good cricket prior to Christmas and this was reflected in the Club Championship table where we were running second, just behind Cockburn. I don't know what happened after Christmas but our cricket went down hill, especially in the top two grades. The 1st grade won one out of the six games after Christmas and the second grade didn't win a solitary game. It seems that the Christmas cheer got into us all and we lost the 'plot'. This has happened in other years and we need to consider doing some training during the three week break over Christmas in coming years. From what started as a promising season we ended up being fairly mediocre towards the end.

The club has banded around the word 'Professionalism' over the last couple of years as the way it wants to travel. It seems that a lot of good ideas have come out of the last two season and now they need to be pulled together to epitify the meaning of Professionalism;

"A high standard of quality and commitment to a desired result in a chosen field'.

It is up to each and every individual to bring professionalism to his game and that means ultimately to the club as a whole.

I would like to thank the committee as a whole who have spent many an hour prior to the season and during the season giving up their spare time to work on improving the club. The players should appreciate the efforts of these tireless few who are the lifeblood of the club. Also to Justin Varney, thanks for your support at training throughout the season.

From a clubs point of view towards next season most of the players realise that the seeds for a successful season have already been put into play. Next season from what I understand will be the first season that we have looked towards prior to the previous season finishing. Plans have been raised with the so called top 20 players of the club and have been generally accepted, also our recruitment plans are well under way. I just hope that these plans and recruitment priorities don't die a slow death once the season is completely over.

Finally, I look forward towards next season with an optimistic attitude towards success. Hopefully all the players will keep cricket in the back of their minds during the off season and be ready for the coming season. I am looking forward to renewing friendships in the new season.

1ST GRADE CAPTAINS REPORT

The losses of Ian Hill and Stuart Kensitt and Phil Cooper deciding to try his luck in the Pennants certainly meant that we had to do some recruiting in the off season. Although we spoke with many a player and had some promising responses we were eventually only able to recruit Jamie Petkovitch. This meant that we were going to have to rely on the local home grown talent to achieve the desired results.

We started with a loss to Phoenix but we showed enough in this game to be a force in the competition and I felt we could only improve on this result.

In the second game of the season we came across North Fremantle. North Fremantle were a side who on their day could defeat anyone in the competition, so it was good to see us convincingly defeat them. The highlight in this game was Brodie Renouf's century. Brodie batted extremely well and was the backbone of our win.

The third game of the season saw us get a hammering from Hilton Park. Our batting certainly let us down on this occasion and this happened more often than not during the season.

Probably our greatest win for the season, bringing with it the confidence for a succession of good wins prior to Christmas, was against CBC, our old foe. CBC scored a fairly convincing 245 for us to chase. On the second day it was one of those days where the rain would come and go bringing with it a lot of delays in play. We were struggling at 5 for approximately 120 when Shannon Andrews joined myself and we set about winning the game. The highlight of this game was Shannon's unbeaten knock of 64, being his first A grade game for the club.

We moved from the two day games to the one day competition after our win against CBC. The first weekend of the one day competition saw us against Kardinya on the Saturday and Cockburn on the Sunday. We defeated Kardinya in a fairly low scoring affair but were walloped by Cockburn on the Sunday after Cockburn only scored a mediocre 168. One loss and one win was a fairly satisfactory result, being that both Cockburn and Kardinya played off in the grand final of the one day competition.

The next game was against Leeming Spartans and in a high scoring affair we managed to hold on by about 20 runs. I think this game epitomised what our team could do if we put our minds to the job. Basically everyone contributed to the win and this game was, I felt, another highlight of the season.

Our last game prior to Christmas was the return game against Phoenix. After our win against Leeming we were running third in both competitions and this game presented the opportunity for us to further cement our claims of playing off in the finals. We won the toss and batted and batted reasonably well by scoring over 200 but Phoneix batted better and we finally succumbed by about 6 runs.

The loss against Phoenix seemed to herald a decline in our results for the rest of the season, although we did manage to beat Hilton Park fairly convincingly. I guess from my point of view we were nearly always in a winning position in every game we played this season but our batting seemed to be our nemesis.

The following are some of the more significant highs and lows of our season:

John Olcyzk's association award for the most number of wickets by any player in the competition was well deserved. John was on of the few who always turned up at training and put his heart and soul into his A grade performances. I would also like to thank John for his support this year as vice captain.

Sticking with training for the moment it was always very disappointing not only for myself but for the players like John who were always at training but did not get the support of other 1st grade players at various times during the season.

As I have said our batting let us down more often than not during the season, but I cannot put the whole of the blame on our batsman for dismal performances. If you don't have the 1st grade bowlers at training then the batsman don't get the required practice they need to succeed. It isn't much help batting against 3rd and 4th grade bowlers if you have to face Gavin Brown who has played A grade pennants and comes off fairly quick off the astro turf and bowls reasonably short.

As I have mentioned Brodie Renouf's century against North Fremantle was another highlight of the season. Brodie batted extremely well and was the backbone of our win against North.

Jamie Petkovitch's improvement after Christmas was tremendous to see. Jamie had a slow start to the season but as the season wore on he became one of our best and quickest bowlers. I hope to see you back next year Jamie.

Our bowlers during the games were tremendous all season. It would be hard to single out any one of the bowlers as I feel they all contributed and this was reflected in the feat that not once during the season did we have to concede over 250 runs in an innings to the opposition. Not many sides, if any at all, can boast this record.

Matty White's obsession with Bourbon after training and after the game certainly kept Justin, Olly and myself up to the mark at times. We even thought of next year having a charactiture of Matty on our cricket shirts smiling, holding a bottle of bourbon with writing underneath "lets have fun". We'll see what the committee says.
