

Player Profile


Eric Krisplan

Eric filled in as a foundation player for the Kardinya Cricket Club in 1973/74. He has the distinction of being of that group of players who has scored a nought in their initial first class innings.

Eric was not asked to play for the club again until halfway through the 1974/75 season. He played in the finals that year and helped Kardinya lose convincingly. In the next two years Eric continued his gradual improvement and scores of 2, 7, 5 and 11 were all posted to his name as runs flowed from the edge of his bat.

Most critics of the game conceded that Eric had that latest ability, but none could offer a solution on how to tap it

He continued his career with East Fremantle/Kardinya Cricket Club when the two clubs amalgamated in 1977/78. He was always selected in one of the clubs four grades and many other players found this strange. 


