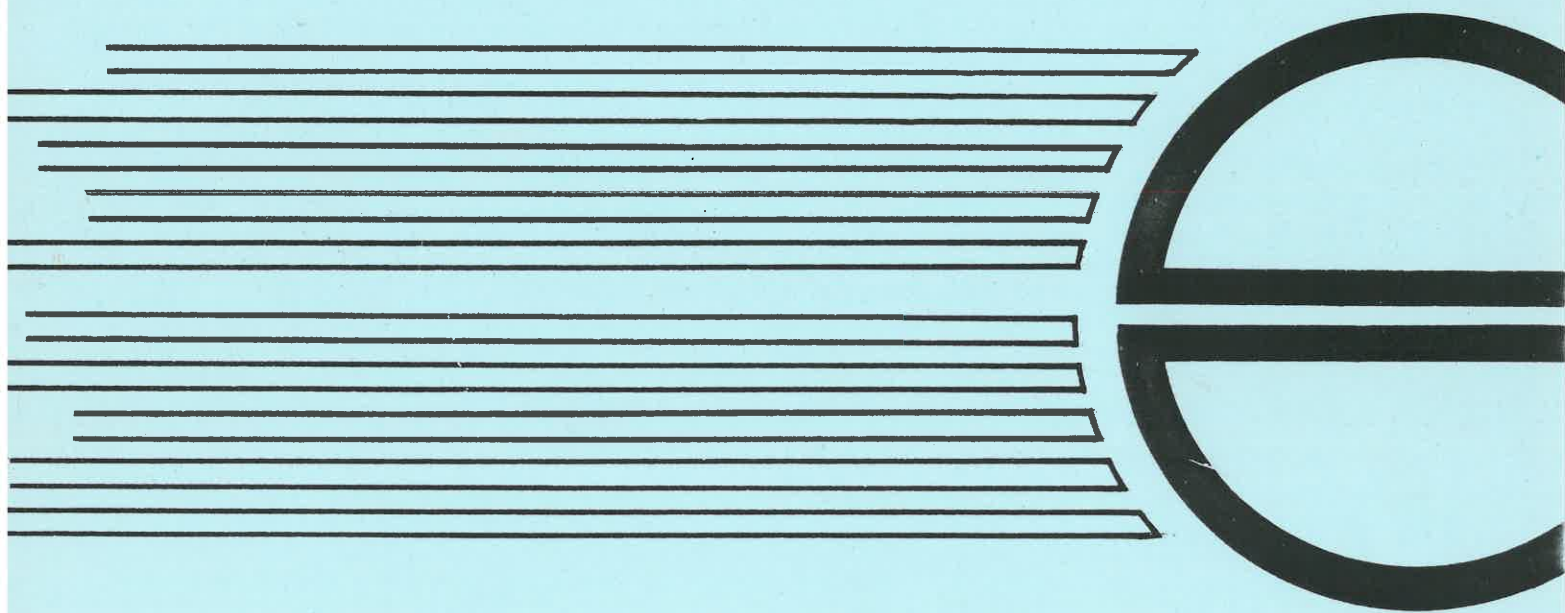

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S CHAIR

At the time of writing this report, a successful season is drawing to a close. Despite significant player losses the first grade team has fought its way into the grand final for the fifth time in eight seasons. This achievement is a tribute to our hard working Captain, Peter Stephen, as is the emergence of outstanding players Russell Waterman and David Cant. It is indeed refreshing to see the young players now taking a more responsible role and this trend must continue.

Our other teams had mixed fortunes, but Second Grade finished the season on a high note, winning their last four games, albeit by narrow margins, epitomising their fighting spirit. Third Grade found the going hard in the tougher competition of this division and will need to be more dedicated next season. Fifth Grade stood a chance of making the finals with two games to go, but ultimately paid the penalty for some narrow losses early in the season. This team was again brilliantly lead by our veteran and life member Les Capes. Sixth Grade, ably lead by Arthur Kelly, did extremely well in the early part of the season, but succumbed to the pressure later on to finish sixth. A highlight of the season was Acting Captain David Vass's highest ever score (42) in the last match of season, when he opened the batting and stayed for 35 overs. Shades of Geoff Boycott!!!

A disappointing aspect of the season was the large player turnover, with some one hundred players being used in the five grades. It appears that some players, especially in lower grades, agree to play cricket when there is nothing better to do, or when it's not too hot. A much higher level of commitment to the Club is required next season if we are to maintain five teams.

A gratifying feature was that despite player unavailability, all teams were still able to field 11 players on most occasions.

At the completion of the season the Club finds itself in a sound financial position, and this is a tribute to Treasurer Mike Leonard and Chief Fund-raisers John Bonser and Peter Stephen. Your Committee will be making overtures to the Town of East Fremantle for upgraded and increased practise facilities for the 1985/86 season and this will undoubtedly require additional fund-raising.

I would like to take this opportunity of thanking my Committee for their support and help during the season, and I repeat my request of last year, we must recruit more people to take an active part in the Club's administration so as to ensure ongoing success. It is also appropriate at this time to congratulate the trophy winners in the various grades, and especially the following, who won Association awards: -

FIRST GRADE REPORT

At the commencement of the 1984/85 season it looked as though the 1st grade side would be battling to win a place in the top four.

At the completion of the qualifying rounds the 1st grade side had finished second with 10 wins and 4 loses.

This was a remarkable achievement considering the number of players that were used and the number of times that we won games from very precarious positions. This however, did create an atmosphere within the players that we could win games regardless of how many runs the opposition had scored or how many wickets we had lost.

Russell Waterman again performed magnificiently throughout the season, scoring two centuries and 79 runs not out in the elimination final, taking 7 wickets and 2 catches. Russell is a fine sportsman and a true competitor.

The big improver for the season was veteran and chairman of selectors Graham Verco. Graham had his best season ever, scoring 465 runs, taking 17 catches and two stumpings.

David Cants contribution of 30 wickets, 149 runs and 4 catches certainly put him in the best allrounder bracket. The highlight of his bowling was his 8 wickets - 48 runs against North Fremantle.

When the side required inspiration we always turned to Thommo and he provided the results. His bowling improved tremendously throughout the season and his total of 17 wickets, 83 runs and 6 catches certainly helped us into the finals.

The return of "Dasher" after Christmas was just the tonic we needed to keep the side going on a winning note.

For our Club to continue as a strength next season we must look at:

- (a) Reduction in the number of sides.
- (b) Appoint a 'Playing' or a 'Non-Playing' Coach.
- (c) More responsibility to younger players, particularly in the administration area.

In conclusion I am sure with more dedication and application from the younger players and assistance from the older players the club will go from strength to strength.

I would like to take this opportunity of thanking the Committee and the players for their assistance and contribution for the past season.

THIRD GRADE REPORT

In the one day game against North Fremantle, Ian Lyons (59) and Chris Tissott combined for our best opening stand (71), the team scoring 5 for 137 from their 50 overs. This gave us our only victory for the season having dismissed North for 114.

Darren Chaplin produced the season's best bowling performance against Jandakot Lakes in November. Chappy gave a fine exhibition of swing bowling taking 6/21 off 8 overs.

A healthy 5/171 in a one dayer against Phoenix in December was the result of a great 105 run stand between John Olczyk (63) and Brad McCaughan (48 not out), in what was our highest partnership for the season. Unfortunately, we just missed out, Phoenix scoring 4/186.

Chappy again proved his worth against CBC, taking 4/22 off 8 overs.

Alan Scalise showed us keeping prowess against North Fremantle, taking 5 top catches. Al completed 7 catches for the season which was higher than any other player this year.

John Bonser's wily spinners earned him 4/34 off 9.5 overs against Jandakot Lakes and this was a great effort. Unfortunately, JB was in Second Grade almost all year and was sadly missed from our team.

Dudley Mason staked his claim as an all-rounder this season, showing great application with the bat, 120 runs from 6 knocks and 5/153 having bowled without luck. Dud hit a fine 66 against Jandakot Lakes in February, batting at No. 3.

In the last game of the season Vic Kostopolous hit a fine 70 not out against Phoenix and combined with Fernando De Sousa in a 56 run partnership for the 4th wicket.

During the season 37 players represented Thirds making the team very unstable. This was primarily in the first half of the season and during this period 3 centuries were hit by the opposition.

Though we did not win a game in the second half of the season, our performance and team spirit improved considerably.

Finally, we would like to thank everybody involved in Third Grade for trying their best throughout the year.

FIFTH GRADE REPORT

The object of entering a fifth grade side for the 1984/85 season was to cater mainly for the veterans in the Club. Unfortunately this did not really eventuate due to other commitments by the veteran element throughout the season. However, the season was enjoyed in the main by those that represented the Club in this grade, winning five games for the season - three out of the last four enabled us to nearly sneak into the finals. We possibly only missed out by one game but left our run too late.

Highlights of the season were; -

Winning the toss on eight out of fifteen spins - once it landed on its edge and we had to toss again, which we duly won.

On four occasions the team made in excess of 200 runs - all of which were successful games.

During the season we bowled a total of 134 wides but only 2 no-balls - (good umpiring by opposition).

Bill Benbow's 100 runs against Jandakot was his first ever century in 32 seasons of competitive cricket. Along with Les Capes (519 runs) in 14 innings, Bill Benbow (238) in 8 innings, and Wally Pin (234) in 16 innings, were the only players to reach 200 runs or more.

"Strawb" Johnston made 4 ducks in 12 innings and accumulated 52 runs in his first season of cricket and will improve. Excellent fieldsman if he doesn't have to run too fast/far.

Bill Peake also managed 4 ducks for the season in 9 innings. Dominic Neff and "Strawb" Johnston both claimed their first wicket in competitive cricket during the season. The bowling performance of Hans Beyer in the opening game against Kardinya in taking 6/60 and later 5/24 versus Jandakot. For the season Hans took 26 wickets in a noteworthy performance.

The vast improvement of "Thommo's" (Chris Thomson) cricket - opening bowler to opening batsman, batted more times than anyone. John Middleton's emergence as a potentially fine fast bowler after an early season injury that could have seen him lost to cricket.

During the season because of a shortage of players Marcus Benbow was introduced to senior cricket - Marcus being only 12 years old, performed admirably. Two performances by Marcus are worth noting in this report, they being taking 4/41 off 8 overs against top side Rockingham and he later kept wickets against Hilton Park and allowed only four byes in 216 runs.

Wally Pin's dismissal during the season when he was "asleep", also Wally's 69 runs - personal best - against Hilton was an excellent innings and showed what Wally can do when not playing in his sleep.

Frank Ness kept wickets with enthusiasm during the year and virtually dropped catches in nearly every game - definitely a hard act to follow.

Veteran Jim Hurst, when called upon, bowled exceptionally well and his efforts in helping out the Club were much appreciated as Jim's skill as an opening bowler is still valued very much for games of this nature.

Another veteran to assist when his work permitted was Ron Goddard who batted well in our "big" win over top side Rockingham. Young Victor Strnadica bowled well in his two appearances with the team and has the potential to become a real asset to the Club in future seasons.

Eric Krispler made his presence felt in the games played in the latter part of the season with some tight bowling stints. Solid batting, excellent fielding and above all unmovable umpiring. Even though Eric was asked to leave the scene for making the correct decision - by passing the buck. Nonetheless Eric's contribution to the team was an example to his team mates in keenness and competitiveness.

Solid contributions were made also by Terry Wright who also has the potential to be a valuable player for the Club. Thanks to other players who contributed to the teams efforts - Peter Brasier, Alan Hawkins, "Froggy" Harrison, Rick Jenkins, Brian Jovanovich, Steve Kelly, The Limb boys, injury prone Danny McAuliffe, the various Trevor McIntyres, Brett Magee, Don Noble, Shaun Patience, and Rob Wright.

As caretaker Captain for most of the season I must in conclusion thank all members for their contributions in making the season an enjoyable one in which I personally appreciated the co-operation, sportsmanship and indeed the company of all concerned.

SIXTH GRADE REPORT

The 6th Grade had a season of mixed fortunes. The beginning of the season up until Christmas, we were riding high in the four, from there we tapered off to be sixth.

One of our memorable wins was the Saturday-Sunday match against Rockingham, at one stage they needed 9 runs and we needed 3 wickets. We got the 3 wickets to win which included 2 run outs. Another was the tied match against Phoenix. It came to the last over and they needed 2 runs and we needed 6 wickets. We took 4 wickets off balls and they got one run to tie the game. It will be a game that all the players will remember for its excitement.

There were some good individual performances during the season. In the bowling department, I had 3 bowlers that shone above everyone else. They were Vic and George Strnadica and Michael Henry. Vic coming in with performances like 3/14 against Cockburn and 4/30 against Hilton. His brother George having 4/27 against Rockingham and 3/68 off 24 overs. Mike Henry consistently bowled well - but never took many wickets - but never had a lot of runs scored against him. Two memorable performances are 1/38 off 27 overs and 4/18 off 8 overs.

Batting, the season was with mixed fortune, i.e. all out for 29 against Hilton then the next week scoring 145 off 40 overs. Individual top scorer in the season was Mike Henry with 62, other scores above 50 were; E Krispler 55, G Strnadica 52, and P Brasier 52. Other outstanding personal scores are; S Kelly 46 not out, D Vass 42, and V Strnadica 41.

In fielding as a team we performed well throughout the season. D Henry took 20 catches in the season which is a good effort for his first season behind the stumps.

Everyone will remember Dave Vass's run out which was never ment to be and never was Dave to have a one handed pick up, the batsman were both stranded mid pitch. Dave sprints (with the ball in his hand) to the bowlers end, gets to the stumps and goes straight past. At this time Dave was the only one with a smile on his face.
