

Trophy winners for the evening were


- a) Mens Don "Clanger" Lang whose bowling included a large number of strikes.





FROM THE PRESENT'S CHAIR

East Fremantle Cricket Club.

President's Report — Monday, 20th July, 1981.

Annual General Meeting.

Gentlemen,

I reported in 1980, at the last AGM, of fragmented representation at FDMCA Council Meetings and a need for us to be heard in the ensuing season. It is history now that our contacts with the Council during the past year were exceptional. Our club did not have one single fine inflicted during the season; we were kept informed of all matters; and our relationships with opposition clubs was most encouraging. The image of the EFCC grew in statue. The credit here is due to the commitment by Gary Simm, Trevor Sprigg and Eric Krispler in their roles with the Council. We look forward to a continued commitment from our members during the 1981-2 season.

On the field, our first grade side finished as runnersup, being beaten by CBC. Our congratulations go to Ken Judge and his team, but probably more appropriately to Trevor and the side for the dedication shown to East Fremantle during a game where fortunes were not with us. Congratulations are due to Des Hoare for his fine performance in winning the Association Batting Average. Des followed the fine example set by previous East Fremantle players with their achievements in FDMCA awards. Graham Verco is also congratulated on attaining an Association Cap for his performances.

The second and third grade sides did not fare as well, but nevertheless they were worthy competitors

throughout the year.

The season concluded with a most successful windup at Amrona's Restaurant in Fremantle and I acknowledge the assistance of genial hosts Lloyd and Ross here.

If the above three points rate as highlights for the 1980-1 then the publication of our own magazine "Stumps", due mainly to the efforts of Eric Krispler and publisher Vin Cooper, must be included as Highlight Number 4. East Fremantle has set the trend with this publication, other clubs regard it as a major contribution to cricket in the FDMCA and I feel sure our lead will be followed.

Financially, our club has weathered the season; we have substantial assets with material, homegrounds and goodwill. There needs to be a total commitment made by all members towards the club. The days of the social cricket afternoons in the FDMCA are over. We need players who will dedicate themselves to the club for the duration of the season. Only then can we succeed. Last season we had 55 players registered and yet struggled to field three teams. We must put those days behind us and aim for success in all grades.
