The fact that none of the four sides were able to make it into the final four, a feat that hasn't been done in 10 years.

First grade's performance during the year has been very disappointing to say the least. Having only won three games during the year, and two of those teams will be playing in the second semi final, finishing first and second on the ladder.

After saying that, you could understand why I've been disappointed with most players due to their attitude and performance.

After losing John Olczyk after the third game of the year and Brodie Renouf being only available every second game, we lost a lot of our batting strength from previous years. To add to that, the retirement of Desmond Hoare after Christmas was an even greater loss. A man with his experience, ability and courage is something that is irreplaceable in any grade of cricket, a highlight of his year was a marvellous 71 made against Spartans. The main factor for our poor season was the lack of personal dedication and self pride, and until these players have a good hard look at themselves and respect for team mates and the club, it will be a long time before the 1st grade are a force in the competition again.

There was a bright side of the year with the emergence of several players coming up through the grades, and with a bit more encouragement and help, these players will establish themselves in the senior side next season. Congratulations go to Brendon Kelly, Richard Newman, Steven Kelly and Danny Buccini, showing a lot of promise.

There were several outstanding performances during the year, none better than the Old Timer Peter Stephen, with his 103 not out against CBC, Des Hoare's 61, Gerry Hart's 81, Murray Robin's 92 and 89, Kevin Munro's 83 and Brendon Kelly's 4/63 in his second game in first grade. John Middleton gave further proof of his ability as a first grade bowler with a very consistent year, taking over 20 wickets, but still has a lot more to learn, and has shown he is very willing to do so.

I would like to say that it was an honour to be picked as captain of the side even though it was our worst year.

I would like to thank Peter Stephen, Graeme Verco and Murray Robins on their on field help and support during the year. Also thanks to the other captains, Alastair Wilkie, Danny Knowles and Arthur Kelly on their help picking sides.

On behalf of myself and teammates, I'd like to thank P Stephen, G Verco, on their tremendous effort in the 1st grade side over the past 10 years.

Thanks to president Graeme Verco and Committee, on the way the club ran off the field, and also to J Bonser on the bowls night and horseracing game. So after all that, I hope all players can have a long hard think about themselves during the off season and come back willing to give 110% next season.

Best Bowling: 12 no balls, 8 wides.

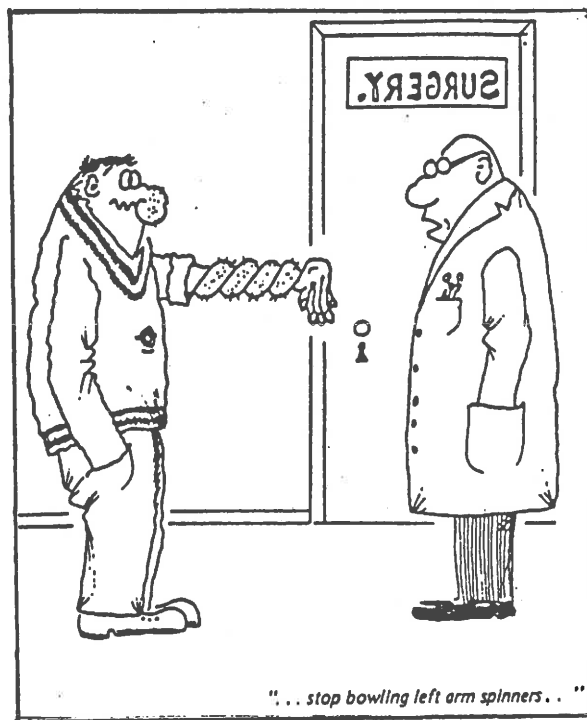

Season 89/90 will not be remembered as a great success, particularly after the heights reached last year. However, it was pleasing to see the club fighting to the finish, notching three wins from four in the final round. Seconds, in particular fought hard to eventually pass Cockburn's score with eight wickets down, and the pressure right on.

Three problems have plagued the team, and indeed the club: depth, stability and fitness. The first two go hand in hand. The loss of several key figures from last season left first grade short. They naturally drew on Seconds' abundant talents, and so it went down the line. A couple of extra players of true First grade ability would relieve this pressure from all grades, and cut down on the experimentation. During the season, 11 places in Seconds were filled by 31 different players.

The experimentation has had its success however, Brendon Kelly and Richard Newman both commenced the season in the lower grades and finished in Firsts. Their stays in 2nd's were all too brief. Troy Grant has also progressed steadily, moving from 4ths to 2nds, and performing admirably wherever he played.

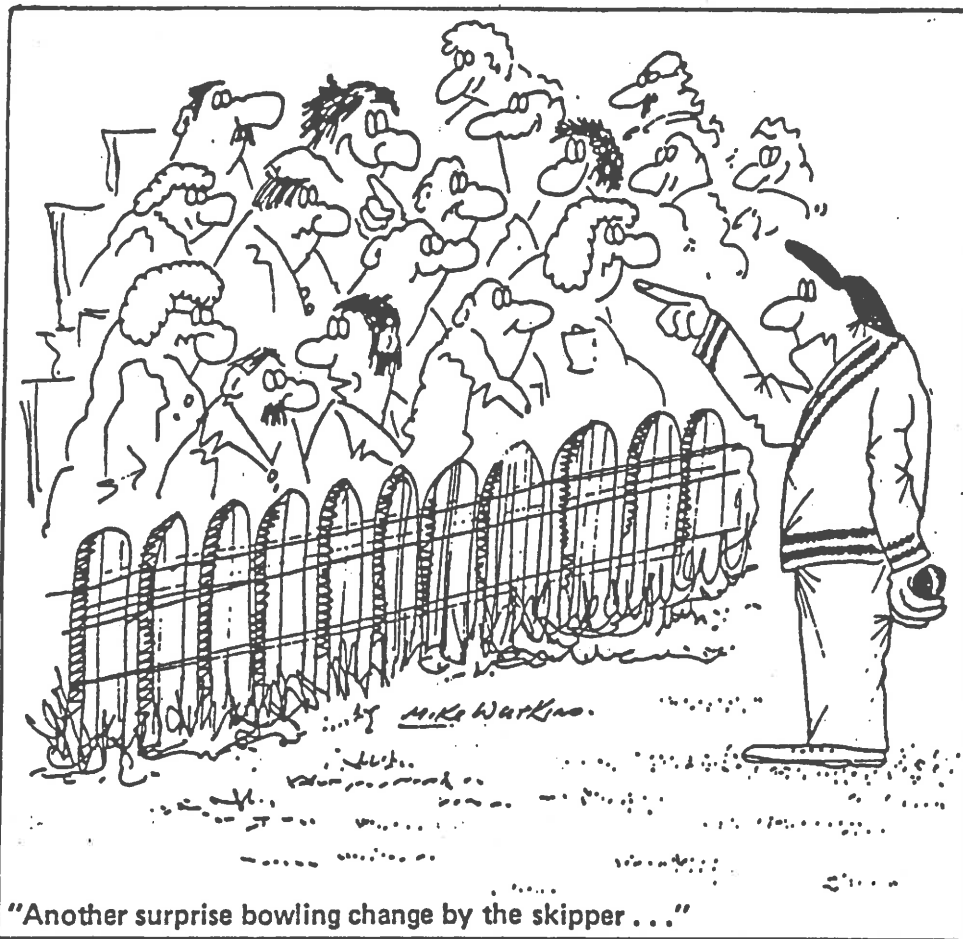

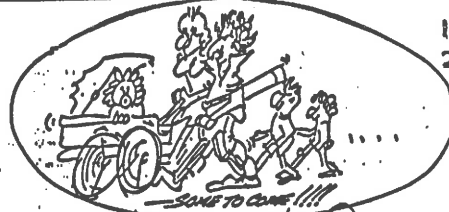

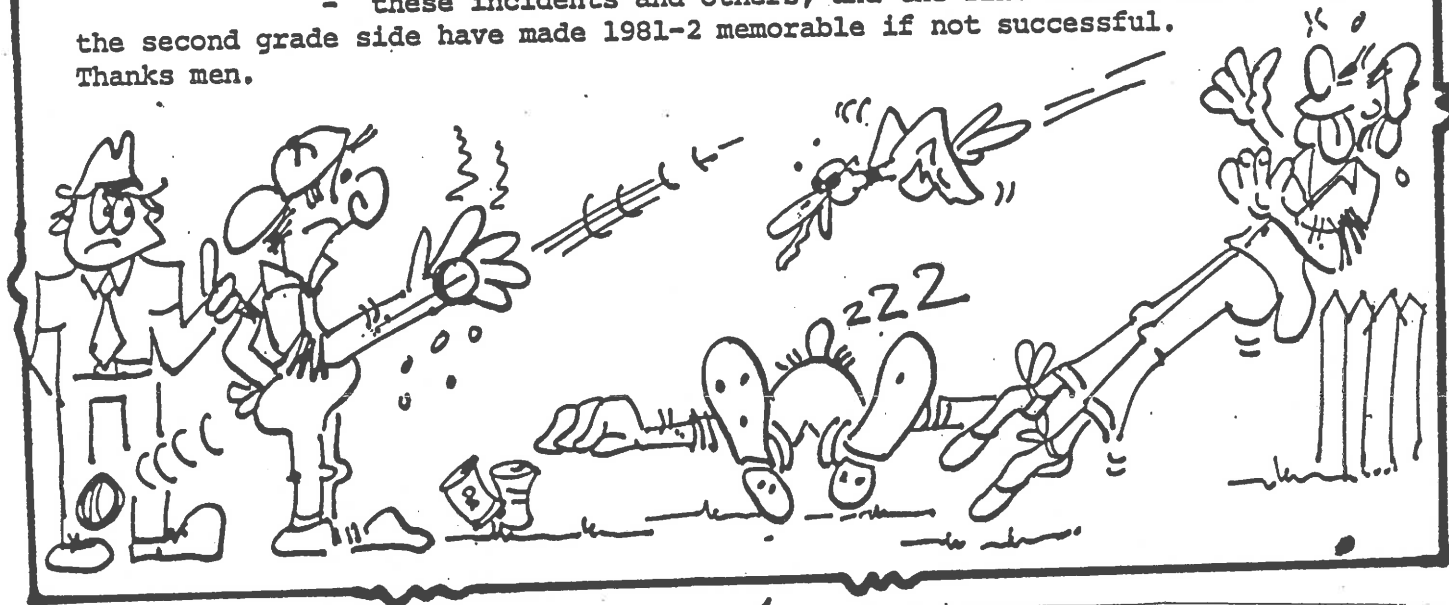
