1990/91

I think that it would be an understatement to say that I'm glad this season is over. When I took on the Captaincy, I had no idea how hard it was going to be and when you don't win a game, it makes it that little bit harder. It was a very tough season for us but when you realise we lost players such as Stephen, Verco, Bradshaw and Robins you'll probably understand why.

There were, however, some very good team and individual performances during the summer and no better batting performance than our 275 against Phoenix. We were chasing the huge total of 341 and we had 5 batsmen make above 20, which was the only time this occurred throughout the year and proved to ourselves that we were capable of making a big score.

The best individual performance came from Gerry Hart against Jandakot Lakes. It was a great dig and we were all disappointed when he was run out on short of a well deserved ton. A great team man, Gezza "toughed it out" when most of us gave in and threw our wickets away. He finished the season with 430 runs and 19 wickets, which was a great effort and I'm sure he'll get better even next year.

Other batting efforts of note were Bruce Heaton's 62 out of 123 vs Cockburn, George Strnadica's 62 vs Kardinya and fifties by Kevin Munro and Graeme Howard. All other players contributed at some stage but the batting seemed to crumble at times when there was little pressure, which was disappointing.

The best individual bowling performance was 3/33 by Howie against Leeming when they were 6/34 but went on to make 7/312. This was typical of our bowling and fielding throughout the year. When the bowlers were bowling well the fielding went to sleep and when both went well we just couldn't get that breakthrough. The main bowlers used, Jon Middleton, Howie, Gerry, Brendon Kelly, Mark Bogensperger and Troy Grant all bowled well at times but with either little luck or no support from the fielders. This is one area where our club does not do enough training. If we are going to put pressure on the opposition, we must improve our fielding and our fitness.

The appointment of Craig Smith as coach this season was a step in the right direction but we must recruit next season and get 2 or 3 experienced players to help our younger players develop further. Bruce Heaton, George Strnadica, Troy Grant and Jay Andrew all improved greatly this year and I'm sure if this continues our club will win the Premiership in a couple of years.

Finally, I'd like to congratulate 2nds and 3rds on their seasons efforts.

Craig was at his top mid season destroying Jandakot (4/9) then ripping through Kardinya's top order the following game (4/30). Mick Glossop (rookie of the year) 20 wickets at 17.80 was tremendous. Mick's a genuine quickie with plenty of fire. Rod (bulldog) Dearle also deserves a special mention. 15 wickets at 23.67 in his first season was a good effort.

Not quite as many highlights batting wise. Robby Butterfield was promoted from fourths early in the season and developed into a solid middle order bat. Three 50's, two of them match winning knocks, saw him take the batting honours. Brad McCaughan (leading all rounder) also batted well scoring over 300 runs with three 50's as well. Phil Swift's solid batting got us off to many good starts. He was involved in three biggest partnerships of the season, 132 against Jandakot, 93 against Cockburn and 90 against Kardinya. A splendid 50 against Cockburn being his best knock.

Darren Caple, Rod Arndt, Steve Baron and Phil Smith all showed promise with the bat throughout the season. Darren led the way with two 50's. A swashbuckling 91 being his top score. Lack of consistency was a problem shared by the middle order though.

I'd like to thank the other team captains Brodie, Stick and Thommo along with selectors Jon Middleton and Craig Smith for their co-operation in selecting sides.

A special thanks to Arthur Kelly for his encouragement and guidance. Arthur did a tremendous job as President in what was a good season for the club.

Finally thanks to all the third grade players. Your support and performances were appreciated. Looking forward to seeing everyone next season.
