2nd Grade Captain's Report

Darren Muir did a great job Captaining the side before Christmas as the team only suffered one loss, which happened to be the first game of the season which I Captained. After Christmas we still only lost one qualifying game so the record of final 9-2 was very good indeed. It was actually on a par with our last two seasons. The only difference this season was probably our ability to consistently make large totals. Our bowling was as good if not better than ever.

Four new players to the top side (and the club) this season helped strengthen our playing depth and all showed the ability to succeed in this grade.

Paul Pirrotina had an erratic year, but with two centuries for the club, showed that we can expect bigger things in the future. His 110 against CBC was one of the best I have ever seen. ~His ability to always be last out of the rooms for warm up was world class. ~

Craig "Funky" Cole was a bit of a floater in the side batting everywhere, bowling spin and medium and even keeping wickets. The good thing about that is that he did all of them very well. I heard his 80 against Canning Districts was a fine knock and his 54 not out vs Lynwood was impressive. ~He was challenging Hoffs early for the "quiet" award but ruined his chances with a lot of swear words late in the season. ~

Grant Woodhead was a very handy pick up for us as we were originally after his brother. I don't think we'll give him back though, because he bowled and fielded extremely well and showed he can bat with a fine 70 not out against CBC batting at number 10. His five wickets against Kenwick were a stand out in a bad game for us. ~Tried to get out of every second game with excuses such as "My goldfish bowl needs cleaning", "I have to go to prison", oh and "I got engaged".

The veteran of this foursome, Jamie Bradley, had a tough season coming in half way through. He batted down the order and did not bowl much due to circumstances but I know what he is capable of and if he comes back next season he will settle into a position that will benefit his talents. ~He also had the amazing talent of being able to look at every other fielder before chasing after the ball.~

Now for the other regular players in the team.

Jason Hof's season last year was one where he was consistent but didn't get the big scores. This season he was the opposite...it was all or nothing. But that is not such a bad thing because it shows that he is maturing as a player. A great century and two big fifties being the highlights of his year. ~Amused his team mates by arriving to each game in a different car.~

Treve Brown started the season off in tremendous fashion with 140 against Cockburn and a 97 against Riverton. He did fade a little bit as the year went on but did a good job taking over the gloves and he can be very happy with his season. The way he strikes the ball I think opposition teams will be in danger if he puts a few more "big ones" together next year. ~Could lose Treve to cycling next year with all the training he's doing. Justin Varney came into the side late this year and was thrust into the opening role. He was very solid from ball one and while his stats may not reflect it, he batted for long periods and gave the middle order something to work with. ~It's a shame we didn't see him bowl "express".~

Kevin Munro was also good at the top of the order but probably needed one or two big scores to top off his year. His opening stand of 69 against CBC with Justin was a highlight. ~Has mellowed when he gets a bad decision because now the bat only travels ten metres.~

Mick Farrell again had a year when he had to work hard to get a bowl, mainly because of the fine efforts of the opening bowlers. I think that he improved another 10 percent this season and I hope he continues to do so. His four wickets against Lynwood was his best but there were times when I think he bowled better for less results. His bowling in the semi final (8-5-1-8) showed how he has matured. ~Could have bowled more if he bought a round before the first game instead of after the last.~

John Olczyk had a magnificent first half of the season taking 29 wickets in six games. His three game lay off probably cost him, but 36 wickets in the season is very handy indeed. 48 not out in the semi final showed that he is still very useful with the willow and probably should bat in the top six. ~

Darren Muir has been a consistent player in this team for many seasons and this one is no different. Any time a player makes 400 runs and takes 35 wickets you know they have had an excellent season. I didn't see his 176 but it is a huge score and the second highest at the club. His 6/42 against Leeming was typical of his bowling for the whole year. He is well deserving of the Club Champion Award. ~ I think that 250 overs isn't bad for a bloke who told me he wasn't going to bowl this year because of his bad back. ~

In summary, it was a very good year if not slightly inconsistent season for us. Remember that apart from the finals we only lost two games all year. The sudden death finals always mean that whomever plays well on the day will go through and unfortunately it wasn't us because we didn't play well.

In the first innings of two day games we had scores of 81, 85, 102, 103 and 107, which makes it hard. Luckily our one day cricket gave the club and ourselves something to cheer about.
