
# **East Fremantle Gricket Glub**



### FIRST GRADE REPORT

First, congratulations to all the first grade players for their efforts over the past season. Finishing the season on top of the table and taking out the Associations Minor Premiership was a first class effort and a great improvement on last season.

Unfortunately our effort in the Elimination Final against Hilton Park was very disappointing. With the exception of a fine inning of 86 not out by Russell Waterman and an all round effort from Rod Walker, the rest of us failed to live up to our expectations.

Maybe this game did highlight our lack of consistency throughout the season. We tend to rely on individuals to win our games instead of all players contributing.

Looking back over the season there were many highlights:

Rod Walker and Andrew Lockyer featured in a magnificent last wicket partnership of 128 runs to steer us to victory against Kardinya.

Russell Waterman's superb knock of 138 runs against Hilton Park. Russell scored 537 runs in first grade this season, and with the addition of the runs he scorded in the Colts competition had a season aggregate of over 800 runs - a fine effort.

This season our top 10 batsmen scored 2668 runs, last season we scored 2206 runs.

In the bowling department the top seven bowlers claimed 126 wickets, last season only 102 wickets. The improvement is obvious.

Last season the Club had only two players who made centuries. This season eleven players made centuries - an exceptional improvement.

Next season I would support a move by our Club to appoint an outside Captain Coach, mainly to regenerate interest, and discipline in our teams.

In conclusion I would like to thank all those who have contributed to the running of the Club this season.

### SECOND GRADE REPORT

The seconds' side was a very popular one having a turnover of 37 players during the summer.

We had a rather undistinguished start to the season against Bullcreek - Spartan, losing by a small margin, a feature which persisted right through. We mostly seemed to be three to four overs or so behind the opposition.

The bright spots included a win over CBC (one day game), a crushing victory over Hamilton, a comfortable win over Kardinya and another win over Hamilton (seems a lot!). On a personal note some outstanding performances were recorded:

A remarkable bowling effort by Alastair Wilkie (9/49) against Hamilton made Eric Sarich wonder how so many catches could go straight to a fieldsman in one short innings! Modesty forbids me to mention the astute field placements. The very next game Eric 'the Rednose' Sarich scorded a scintillating 145 after being felled by a bouncer. When aided and assisted in a dazed state from the field we asked of him, "Eric how many runs have you scored?" Straight back came Eric, "84 - I'm certain." A quick check of the scoreboard proved him right. He returned to the crease later to carve up the bowling in courageous fashion.

Perhaps the best bit of cricket came from Wayne Capes in the one dayer against Hamilton. Wayne clouted six sixers in his brilliant 107 not out. It's not often one sees a batsmen score 46 runs off the last three overs, including three lost balls into the Swan River.

The shock of the season occurred when Jim Hurst, in making three "guest appearances" during the summer for our side was "no balled" at Parry Avenue in the Bullcreek - Spartans one dayer. This was truly unbelievable. Jim told me it was the first no ball he had bowled - ever! (Although it did re-occur later in the season). Even the umpire was upset.

Val Steenholdt made a late season appearance and did more than enough to show that he could have been the difference between sixth and perhaps second or third place in the competition. Val always gave of his best and upset more than one opening batsman with his fast bowling. His best performances were 7/117 against Rockingham and 5/46 vs. Phoenix Cockburn. He always had something up his sleeve and performed some unusual antics both batting and bowling. A great competition.

There were some characters in the team notably Rod Thompson. Thommo was always performing below his 'ideal' best - but returned some good alround results nevertheless. He featured in some glarious run outs (as a speciality) and dropped some "classic catches" - but to be fair he held some very good ones (one off my bowling).

Mike "Yap, Yap" Leonard was always trying behind the stumps and always played it out to the finish. A most unrewarding task, wicket keeping. Mike also collected the ball fees and carted the gear around for most of the season, as well as bringing along some drinks. Well done, Mike!

Don Lang joined the side in the fourth game and had a steady batting influence during the season, although he was always crook on me for taking the ball off him at vital stages. Don suffered an unusual injury to his fielding finger at Parry Avenue. I can't describe it here and it didn't look good at the time, but anyway Don was out for three games because of it.

Peter Tyson bowled his off-spinners very well for most of the season prior to a "Planter Wart" in his heel putting him out of action.

Gary "legside" Mather bowled well in his few stints with us and took some excellent catches.

A young chap; Brodie Renouf who came to us for the last two games, batted very ably and fielded without complaint. I hope he comes back next season as he will be an acquisition to the club.

Finally I would like to thank those players who fronted up for, and contributed to the second grade side during the season (and have not been mentioned so far).

### CAPTAINS REPORT - FOURTH GRADE

Although disappointed at losing the Grand Final I felt the season was a great success for the fourth grade representatives.

The year did unearth some fine individual performances and if continued must strengthen the Club through all ranks in the years to follow.

Alan Scalises work "behind the stumps" was superb considering he missed the early part of the season he still managed to capture 30 victims (29 catches and one stumping). At the completion of the qualifying games he had taken 22 catches which won him the association trophy.

Well done Alan.

The bowling attack headed by the reliable and consistent Graham Sharpe complimented by the somewhat aggressive Dudly Mason combined to capture 55 wickets between them at a cost of less than 14 runs per wicket.

This combination was magnificently supported during the final series by Brent Taylor who captured six wickets for 24 runs from 32.4 overs.

Whilst during the qualifying games Garry Mather and I did give the pair the assistance and finished with 15 wickets at an average of 16.5 runs per wicket and 27 wickets at an average of 17.4 runs per wicket respectively.

The batting which on occasions lacked endeavour did have two shining lights and with more experience both will undoubtedly play "A" Grade for East Fremantle.

Both Tony Miguel and Graham Howard produced above 40 averages for the home and away games to be separated by only .1 before the finals.

While on batting, the efforts of Brad McCaughhan during the semi-final to top score in both innings topped off by three brilliant catches was a fine effort.

R Wallis, A Scalise, and B Taylor also demonstrating the same determination in the final and showed the "stars" how runs can be scored under pressure.

Although our batting throughout the year was inconsistent and at times very weak I feel our bowling and fielding improved each week and finally developed into the best attack in the entire fourth grade competition.

To look one step further next year we need to develop a solid opening batting combination a challenge which an in form David Clarke could readily accept and with Steve Duncan, who fitted like a glove into this side, will place the pressure on any side they meet.

This report would not be complete without recognition to players who although they did not make the final selection were in a large way instrumental in making this year the success it was.

Two who performed very well with both bat and ball were D Noble and D Blanchford and their efforts indicated the difficulty experienced in any selection.

Senior players Les Capes, Don Lang, and Jim Hurst did provide the blending and framework necessary to build successful combinations.

The administration efforts of Trevor Sprigg, Peter Stephen, Graham Verco, Don Lamb, and Mike Leonard need to be mentioned as these people are the cornerstones of this successful Club.

The year itself was very rewarding for me both as a player and captain and the efforts of the fourth grade players, especially during the latter half of the season made my cricket enjoyable both on and off the field.

#### SIXTH GRADE REPORT
