Firstly, Congratulations to Murray and the First Grade side on their inspirational victory in the grand final. I believe they set an example for all to follow and reminded me that the game isn't over till the last ball has been bowled.

I took over the captaning mid season from Tony Hill and I thank him for his efforts prior to this. The season was generally good for us. We won five of the nine two day games which was unfortunately not quite enough, leaving us less than one point out of the finals. In the one day competition we were unbeaten with the highlight being a sensational victory over Cockburn. Defending only 83 runs Cockburn was dismissed for 60. Unfortunately a protest by Rockingham over an alteration to the scorebook was upheld and we were disqualified from the one day finals. I deeply regret this and accept responsibility for depriving the Club and my players of a Grand Final appearance.

On a brighter note the season produced many individual highlights. Tony Hill was the pick of the bowlers taking 32 wickets at an average of 15.09. This included 7/38 in his very first match with the club.

Mike Leonard again proved his worth behind the stumps. He held 26 catches and is also a great clubman. Terrific stuff!!!

Top of the batting this year was Brad Mant who slogged 324 runs at an average of 40.5 including three scores in the eighties. Brad is an aggressive batsman with a good eye but needs to improve his attitude if he is to become a real class cricketer.

Steve "Harry" Harrison also shone with the bat but deserved better than 211 runs at 30.14. He is quoted as saying "I'm not out of form just out of luck".

The team has an abundance of all-rounders not the least of which is Bobby Magee. He compiled 206 runs (Av 18.73) and took 13 wickets (Avg. 26.54) as well as snapping up nine catches. Congratulations to him on a fine effort.

Bruce Heaton, Rob Azzopardi, and Brent Taylor also deserve mention for their all-round abilities. I feel that we can expect a great deal more from them in the future.

Another exciting prospect for the future of this club is Rob Heaton. Although only sixteen, Rod appears quite comfortable at this level, and will develop into a fine player as the years go by.

It is normal for a second grade side to lose players to the firsts. This year was no exception. Brodie Renouf only played five games for us but made more than 40 in four of these appearances. Kevin Munro had a similar record (two forties and a fifty from five innings) before the talent scouts from above snaffled him up. Gerry Hart was not with us long either and Tony Martinan jumped from thirds to first very quickly after showing good form with the ball.

Generally speaking this is a very young side with a lot of natural talent. Given a little more discipline and dedication we will become a very tough side to beat. I look forward to this in the coming season.

Finally I would like to thank the committee, in particular Graeme Verco, Brian O'Donnell and Mike Leonard, for their efforts. They are greatly appreciated.

Although not competing in the final of either the one day or two day competitions this year there were enough signs to feel optimism. It would be fair to say that we were in a position to make the four and that it was in our hands but we "dropped" the "chance". Prior to this all players had shown great determination and had at times played above themselves to have that chance to make the final four after looking certain "also rans".

The team spirit shown was such so as to make the job of Captain easy and this was a real credit to all players.

Our batting was disappointing and unless we accept responsibility when batting we will never win the important games. Unfortunately, we relied on a few outstanding individual performances. This year only five players scored over 150 runs for the season and one of these players (Trevor Sprigg) did so in only five innings, including a fine century. Other good knocks were:

64 - Stick Kelly  
63 - "Harry" Harrison  
54 - Swifty

Congratulations to these players.

The season saw a couple of players who, I believe will rapidly move up the grades over the next few seasons. Among these players, Jay Andrew batted extremely well on occasions and only needs to concentrate every innings to become a really good player. His effort when taking over the keeping duties was first class and he figured in 18 dismissals. Danny Knowles also can be well satisfied with his season. Until a transfer in his employment caused him to miss several games, Danny also claimed 18 victims behind the stumps. Rod Heaton, although he only bowled around 30 overs showed enough to suggest that next season he will get a bundle of wickets. Stick Kelly should definitely play "A" Grade in time as soon as he learns to curb his natural aggression a bit and not try to hit every ball out of the ground.

On the bowling side, the need for a regular strike bowler to use the new ball is a definite must. Troy Brophy (4/24 vs Phoenix) and Brad McCaughan (5/54 vs Kardinya) bowled well on occasion and, of course, Tony Martinan (7/51 and 3/30 vs Bullcreek) early in the season saw Tony promoted to higher grades. Brendan Kelly was a good find and his 14 wickets at 13.5 was a great effort.

I felt each of these bowlers could perform so much better with a genuine opening bowler operating from the other end.

Trevor Sprigg completed an excellent double and rounded off a good part season for him by taking 13 wickets at an average of 17.0 off 60 overs.

On the whole our attack was as good as any in the competition and everyone should be pleased with their efforts as many times poor batting placed extra pressure on the bowlers to perform.

There are a few others who deserve a special mention for their contribution throughout the year.

Graham Swift - his season started in a flurry with his first three games producing an average of 34 runs including a solid 54 vs Hilton Park. Unfortunately, his form fell away slightly during the one day games and it was hard for him to regain the touch, but his determination was never in doubt. Brian O'Donnell and Mark Simpson provided magnificent support for Trevor Sprigg and enabled us to defeat Jandakot - our first major step toward the four. From 7/76 to all out 230 was a real highlight. D Lang and B Renouf - these players provided a great example that if you do the hard work in the field results will follow. Steve Duncan - his on field assistance throughout the year was tremendous. Also, I must acknowledge Peter Cromwell for his time as Captain before injury.

The off field activities of the Club this year were conducted successfully and players such as the two H's, David Vass, Braddy and, of course, Mike Leonard are greatly appreciated. Graham Verco, President, did an excellent job and his policy of making a few hard decisions and placing the Club above all individuals can only benefit the future of EFCC.

Last season, our sixth grade side finished in the top four, while our fifth grade side finished last. With changes to the format of the Association, these two sides were basically combined and thrown into 4th grade. With the loss of talented players such as Bruce Heaton, Steve Harrison, Steve Kelly, Peter Cromwell and Troy Brophy to higher grades, it was always going to be a tough season.

The early part of the season failed to produce a victory, as most players struggled to adapt to the quicker and more accurate bowling of opposition teams. Exceptions were Rob Butterfield (4/39 v Hilton), Mick Cullinane (27 and 3/55 v Phoenix) and Peter Brasier (42 n.o. v Hilton). Rob Azzopardi was a welcome addition to the side for two games before Christmas, taking 3/29 and scoring 14 and 31 v Bullcreek.

The team scored an outright victory (thanks to a "sporting" declaration) over Rockingham in Round 5. The bowlers toiled to dismiss Rockingham for 254 (Wilkie 3/59, Azzopardi 3/65), and the batsmen replied with 166, our highest score for the season to date. Doug Copley (a player of the future) scored a sparkling 45 not out, and was ably supported by Alastair Wilkie (28) and Stalwart David Vass (24). Rockingham captain Eric (ET) Smith astonished all present by declaring his second innings closed at none for none, and the required 90 odd runs were easily knocked off by Rob Azzopardi (41 not out) and Doug Copley (20). This game showed that with the addition of a couple of class players the 4th grade side was a very competitive combination.

The team was competitive (although unsuccessful) in all one dayers, almost snatching victory against Hilton and Cockburn, and dismissing top side Phoenix for 106. There were solid individual contributions by:

Rob Butterfield (31 not out and 2/22 v Hilton, 3/10 v Phoenix and 3/34 v Cockburn),

Chris Thomson (3/25 v Hilton),

Brad McCaughan (4/20 v Phoenix); and

Arthur Kelly (37 v Rockingham)

Losses to Kardinya and Jandakot occurred after Christmas, despite some improved batting by Troy Grant, Chris Thomson, David Vass and Peter Brasier and Thommo's excellent 5 for 40 against Jandakot.

Fourths returned to the winner's circle against North Fremantle. Scores of 38 by Brian O'Donnell and 28 by Brodie Renouf were supported by Rob Butterfield's 4/31 and Chris Thomson's 3/33, and the first innings win was almost converted into an outright on the second day.

The season also finished on a bright note, with our highest score for the season (190) being scored against Cockburn. With scores of 58 by Brian O'Donnell and 47 by Peter Brasier, and a solid 25 - run 10th wicket partnership between Dave Henry and the evergreen Kevin Johnston, a side of battlers had been converted into a competitive combination. As players such as Troy Grant, Doug Copley and Rob Butterfield continue to develop, with the possible inclusion of senior players from other grades, fourths should continue their promising late-season form next season.

Finally, congratulations must go to all who participated in First Grade's magnificent premiership victory. The first premiership in 52 years will hopefully be the first of many to come in the near future.
