#### PRESIDENTS REPORT 1991/92

Due to some excellent hard work by Arthur Kelly and his committee the previous year we were in a financial position to try and improve our playing stocks for the current season. There is no doubt that the club made the right move in shifting our social activities to Preston Point. Although it means hard work the cricket club owes a lot to Arthur and especially Peter Cromwell who spends countless hours behind the bar making sure our club is financially secure.

Our committee decided at the start of this season to appoint a club coach and offer incentive money to players who we thought would strengthen "A" grade ensuring then that all grades below would also become stronger. It was imperative that the right type of people be approached especially when you compare what has happened to several clubs this year.

David Dunstan was appointed club coach. I feel our performances this year have vindicated our faith shown in David, bearing in mind we finished second on the club championship a mere 150 points behind Phoenix who fielded six sides compared with our four. David's coaching methods proved successful simply by noting the number of players who attended training both nights throughout the year.

Once David was appointed we then approached Stuart Kensitt and Mike Dunstan and were successful in convincing them to play for East Fremantle. Then John Olczyk came back and Phil Cooper also became a tremendous opening bowler and before we knew it we had a very strong and competitive "A" grade side. After finishing last in 1990/91 our "A" grade side have been magnificent this year in finishing 3rd and with an ounce of luck could have finished on top. 2nd grade also were magnificent finishing on top of the ladder losing only one game all year. Daniel Knowles was again captain of 3rd grade and they also were great all year, just missing the finals in the last game of the year. John Bonser had the thankless task of leading 4th grade and for them to miss out on the final four by 1 1/2 points was truly a remarkable effort.

As previously mentioned we owe a lot to Peter Cromwell who has again been fantastic. We thank you Peter and for all your good work we wont charge you any rent. What about VASSY. What a clubman. Wo remembers the famous "CAT BURGERS" after training and also on Saturday nights. Vassy you are worth your weight in gold and all the members really appreciate all the work you do. Special thanks firstly to Roo who was our association delegate and from all reports did a fine job and secondly to Phil (Swifty) worked extremely hard behind the bar as Crommy's right hand man and Phil you have been magnificent all year. Bruce Heaton also spent countless hours behind the bar and due to Crommy, Phil, Vassy and Bruce we have been able to survive financially which is great in these tough economic times. Thanks to all the committee and your support.

At the time of writing this report both A grade and 2nd grade are preparing to play in the Preliminary Finals. Best of luck to both sides and hopefully both sides can win through to the grand final. Once there you have a chance and who knows at our windup we could be celebrating two premierships.

Finally thanks to all members and players for your continued support and remember you are the people that make our club tick and without you we would struggle to survive. Once again many thanks and hope to see you all next year.

Without doubt these are the front line people pulling the strings and making the important decisions, but a club and it's success will always get down to how the players perform on the day. In this regard each and every individual that represented the club this season is to be highly commended - the results speak for themselves.

It was stated to me very early in the piece that the objective of the committee was to firstly appoint a club coach, then recruit a first grade captain plus an accomplished batsman. My sincere thanks go out to Peter Stephen, firstly for his advise regarding the playing strength of each and every player, especially way back at the start of the season, and secondly, and most importantly, in his capacity as chairman of selectors. This is not a very onerous position but Peter handled it with aplomb. Great effort Peter.

I guess some sort of condolences should go out to Daniel Knowles as captain of the thirds. Had he been able to field his full side after the Xmas break I have no doubt they would have been in very strong contention for a premiership flag. To be decimated by injuries and suspensions to key players was a bitter pill to swallow. But take heart Daniel, you have done an excellent job.

The same goes for John Bonser. All season selection of the fourth grade side was dependent on who was available after the top three sides were chosen, and very seldom was it possible to field a settled and stable line-up. Due to these circumstances the results obtained by the fourths was outstanding. A spot in the four would have been just rewards to John for the quality of his performance throughout the season.

In closing I would like to sincerely thank Graham Verco and his committee for backing me all the way and being largely responsible for the enjoyment I have endured. Many thanks also to everyone else for their co-operation. A lot of success in the future is inevitable if the same attitude prevails.

#### FIRST GRADE CAPTAINS REPORT 1991/92

A successful year but one which has hopefully shown us the few deficiencies which prevented us from being the best team in the competition.

This, I feel, is an honest appraisal of how the season went for the A grade side. For a side to finish a win-less last to third the following season is a fantastic effort and all players are to be congratulated.

When I accepted the job as A grade captain, I went in prepared for the worst. What I found was a nucleus of players who are not only highly skilled cricketers, but had the right attitude and desire to succeed. I would like to thank all players in A grade for this commitment shown and for the support and backing I received throughout the year.

There were many brilliant and inspired performances throughout the season and no season report would be complete without mentioning these. Peter Stephen made a fine return to A grade cricket this year with two centuries (both against CBC) and many other fine scores to easily win the batting average and aggregate. John Olczyk showed time and time again why he is regarded as perhaps the best all-rounder in the competition with many match winning performances with both bat and ball, whilst Mike Dunstan made a slow start with the bat but excelled behind the stumps and was rewarded with 25 catches. To my way of thinking, Mike is the most talented batsman in the competition and this was shown in the way he compiled a hundred against Hilton Park with application, he will become a very good player.

Phil Cooper, our number one strike bowler, struck fear in all opposing batsmen and was rewarded for his pace, fire and skill in capturing the most wickets this season. I know Phil has been approached by several Pennant clubs to play for them next season, but I hope East Fremantle can keep his services as players of his ability are essential for a club to be successful.

Last, but not least, I must mention the efforts of Graeme Howard, the reluctant A grader. "Howie" had a magnificent season as an all-rounder, including 4 for 5 against North Fremantle, a match winning 54 not out against Cockburn and the discovery that as a slip fielder, he has few peers. His catching was inspirational at second slip and won us at least two games. I would like to mention the many other fine performances from players during this season but space is limited. Suffice to say that every player contributed to a team win at some stage of the year and can be proud of how we performed as a team.

As mentioned at the start, I feel that there are a few aspects of our game that need improving if East Fremantle are to continue being a force in A grade. Although our fielding was generally of a high standard, in many games our concentration wavered and we allowed the batting side to get on top. Concentration must be maintained for 80 overs, otherwise catches will be dropped and the fielding will become sloppy and not of an A grade standard. Unfortunately this occurred a number of times and our hard work at training became wasted.

Another aspect that needs to be addressed is the application to batting. Many times during the season we got off to a good start only to see 3 or 4 quick wickets fall as a result of our batsmen playing "millionaire" shorts or attacking shots too early. We must learn to value our wicket and show some fight and guts to remain out in the middle - you can't make runs from the sideline no matter how many beers you have.

To sum up, if East Fremantle are to remain a force next season, the side must improve. This may sound funny after our successful year, but if we remain at the level we have reached this year, and be content with this, then the other sides will quickly reach and surpass us in the quest for a grand final win.

East Fremantle need to keep the nucleus of this current team and add a few players - another leading batsman, a quality spin bowler and maybe a wicket keeper/batsman - to maintain our position at the top of the ladder.

Many thanks to Dave Dunstan and Graham Verco, plus the committee (especially Peter "Pigeon" Cromwell) for their support and help over the year and a big thanks to all the people who I've had a beer or bundy with in the bar - very enjoyable.

### THIRD GRADE CAPTAINS REPORT 1991/92

An extremely disappointing season. After being in a strong position with 7 wins and three narrow defeats the side fell away, failing to win a game during the last 4 rounds. A draw with Phoenix was our best effort. Unfortunately there was a lack of commitment from some players. Injuries and suspensions also cost the side dearly. To be successful next season there must be total commitment from all players.

There were many highlights throughout the season. Most of these occurred early in the season. Brent Taylor, Troy Grant and Robbie Butterfield crashed through the Jandakot batting line up twice capturing figures of 4/10, 4/33 and 5/7 respectfully in the first game. A thrashing of CBC followed, when chasing 180 we amassed 349 (Greg Howard 64 not out, Mick Glossop 57, Steve Baron 45, Daniel Knowles 60 and Troy Brophy 38) our best score for the season.

Unlike previous seasons batting was our strength, Steven Baron with 1 hundred (CBC) and 2 fifties led the way. An unfortunate knee injury brought an early end to his season. Greg Howard showed he can bat as well as bowl with 2 fifties and a number of other good scores. Mick Glossop showed that a good eye and plenty of power are key requirements to make runs, over 300 runs (most in boundaries) was a top effort. Robbie Butterfield, Darren Caple, Vic Strnadica and Stick Kelly all contributed at some stage. A lack of consistency was a problem shared by the top order.

Failing to dismiss sides clearly was a problem. Poor fielding and a lack of depth in our attack were the main factors. Harder work and more appearances at training practising fielding drills was required. It was easy to see the benefits of fielding practice by the example firsts and seconds set.

The bulk of the bowling was shared by Mick Glossop and Greg Howard, 35 wickets including 6/59, 5/82 was an outstanding performance from Mick. Greg also performed well taking 25 wickets with 2 5 packs, 5/37 being his best. Troy Grant took 17 wickets but I'm sure he will be looking to improve on that effort next season. Robbie Butterfield, Steve Baron and Troy Brophy showed good form early with the ball but were hampered by injuries and suspension. Two bowlers that impressed me later in the season were Royce Guidera and Chris Spinella. Both showed plenty of pace and enthusiasm. They should, with the guidance of more experienced bowlers, develop into quality performers.

I'd like to take the opportunity to congratulate Stewie Kensitt and Dave Dunstan. They both did an outstanding job getting their respective sides into the finals. Also John Bonser did a remarkable job with the 4th grade, given their poor start to the season, to just miss out on the finals. Special thanks to Graham Verco for his encouragement and guidance. Also Peter Cromwell for his efforts on the field and off. Once again a terrific job behind the bar was done.

Finally thanks to al the third grade players. Looking forward to more success next season.
